I appreciate the endless number of career opportunities that mosquito control has to offer.

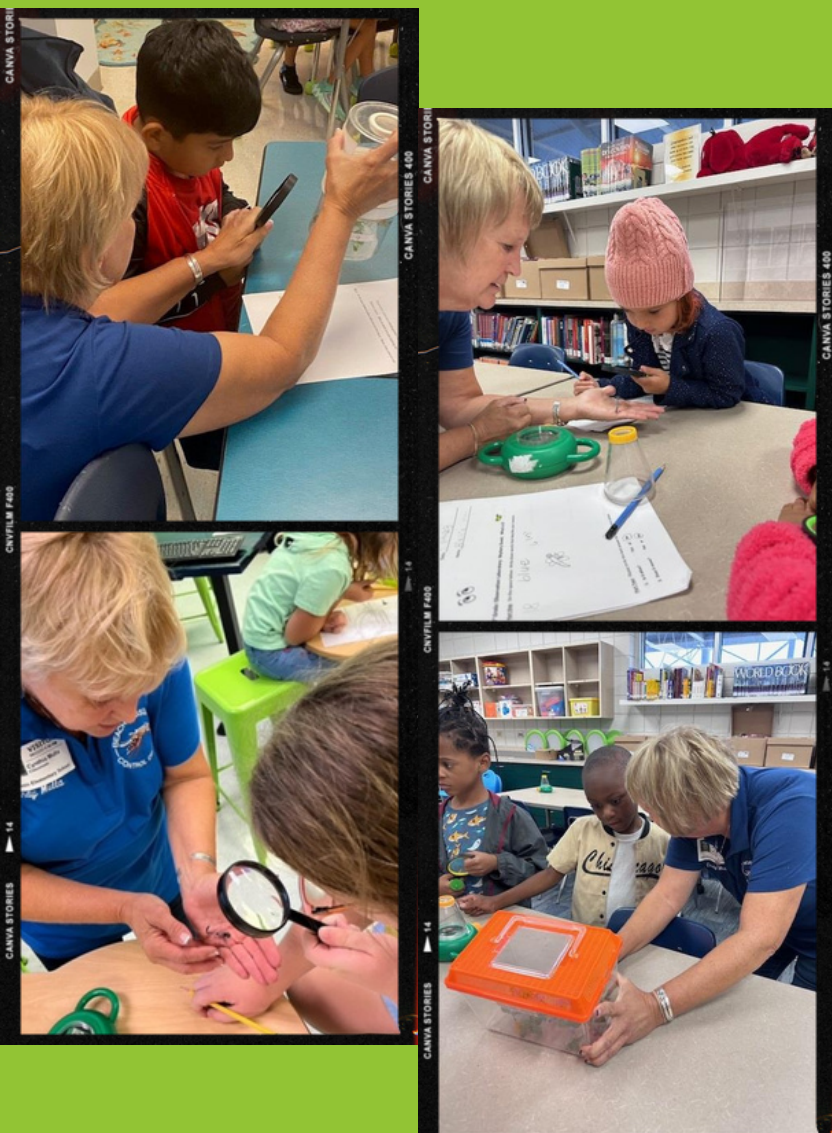
